MC/OSHPD at UCLA Ted	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every 4 months, the Med Centers - UCLA, Irvine, Davis, UCSF, San Diego – meet with OSHPD • UC sites present; this month will also give an update on the Carbon Neutrality Initiative • Ted reporting for UCSF on behalf of Sukhi, Energy Director • Report to OSHPD contains highlights on what the Med Center is currently doing - lighting in parking garages, changing to LEDs, etc • Clean energy and buying offsets will be the bulk of how we get to carbon neutrality 		
Sterilizer Replacement Project Eli	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New UC Sustainable Water Policy – policy states all new equipment has to be connected to an existing recirculated cooling system instead of once through cooling • Sterilizers are expensive ranging from \$50,000 - \$100,000; there's added cost to be connected to recirculating system • Working with the City to set up rebates and recently received first rebate from the City • Study - Water metering for 2 months of the old equipment, and then metering new equipment for 2 months to compare • Genentech Hall – 7 sterilizers coming in September, Helen Diller – got funds to replace 2 cage washers (combined uses half the building's water) coming in January • UCSF revised contract with sterilizer supplier - Getinge - to make sure that the equipment that is purchased meets the new policy • Challenge: little more expensive; labs are responsible for paying, so working with City for rebates to defray costs is key • Labs purchase the equipment and then work with CPFM for the rebates. CHESC Highlights Lyan, Veronica, Jamie	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lyan: UC Davis Energy Dashboard – Campus map with real time energy use per building type (lab, office, classroom). Website: http://ceed.ucdavis.edu/#/ <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ We have a one page snapshot on energy use sent out to PIs, problem with that is there is no call to action. Rebates can help incentivize behavior/actions. ○ ArcGIS/our space team that has building locations of bottle fillers, etc. Can be done if prioritized and funded. We have all the building maps, and bringing in the data should be straightforward ○ Maybe we as a group (climate change WG?) could make a request for the space team to prioritize a project like this. ○ Realtime energy tool is SkySpark managed by Facilities • Erick: Lyft-Line - after hours guarantee program – right now for students only. UCSF will give students \$15 credit which covers approx. 5 mile boundary. Goal is to have this by September 1, fall session. Eventually roll out to physicians/medical personnel. • Veronica: LEED Gold – Mission College – Pursued Geothermal options, able to go horizontally without hitting aquifers • Veronica: How to do more social networking engagement – East Bay Christian College: asked people “What change would you like to see?” and found their champions through that • Veronica: Solar powered umbrellas. Some restrictions: Gene Friend Way not possible due to fire truck access and safety related to wind • Jamie: UCSC developed an energy/emissions strategy tool but requires significant resources to enter all strategies and results may be the same –sourcing - more onsite clean energy and carbon offsets 	<p>Monica and Gail to brainstorm ArcGIS project</p> <p>Monica and Erick to discuss UCSF Lyft-Line pilot</p>
