- An opportunity for UC to lead the way



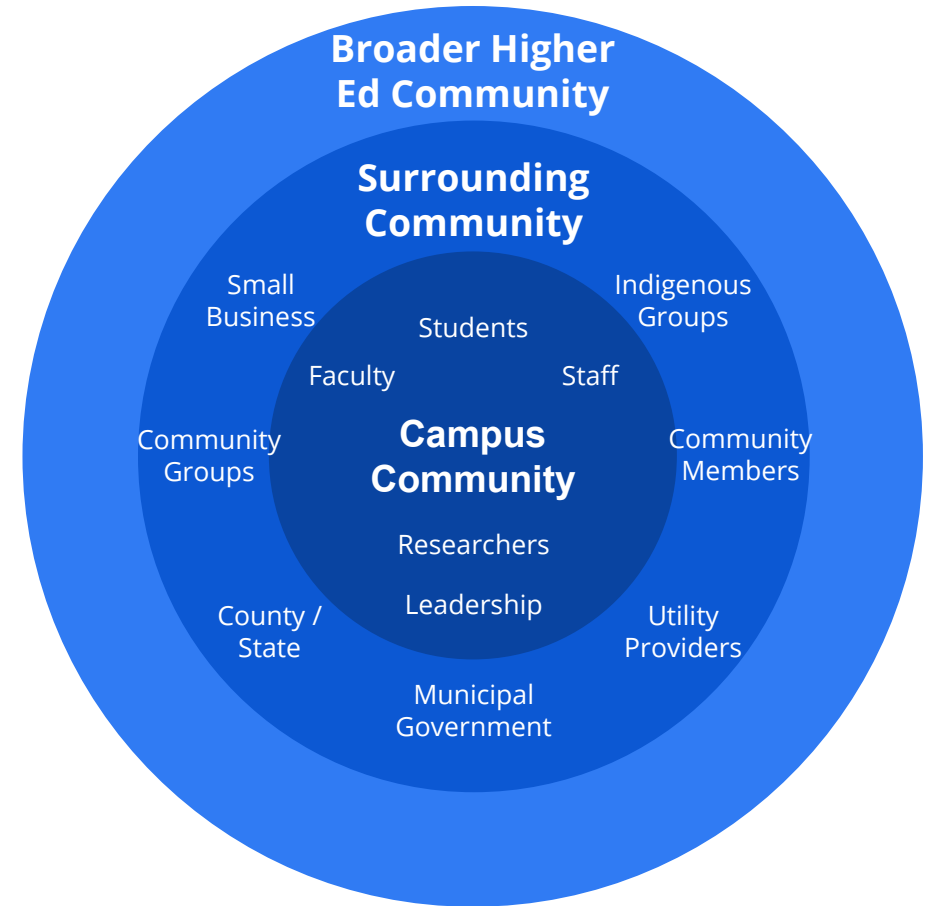
UC Project Goals

- Identify and prioritize potential actions and strategies



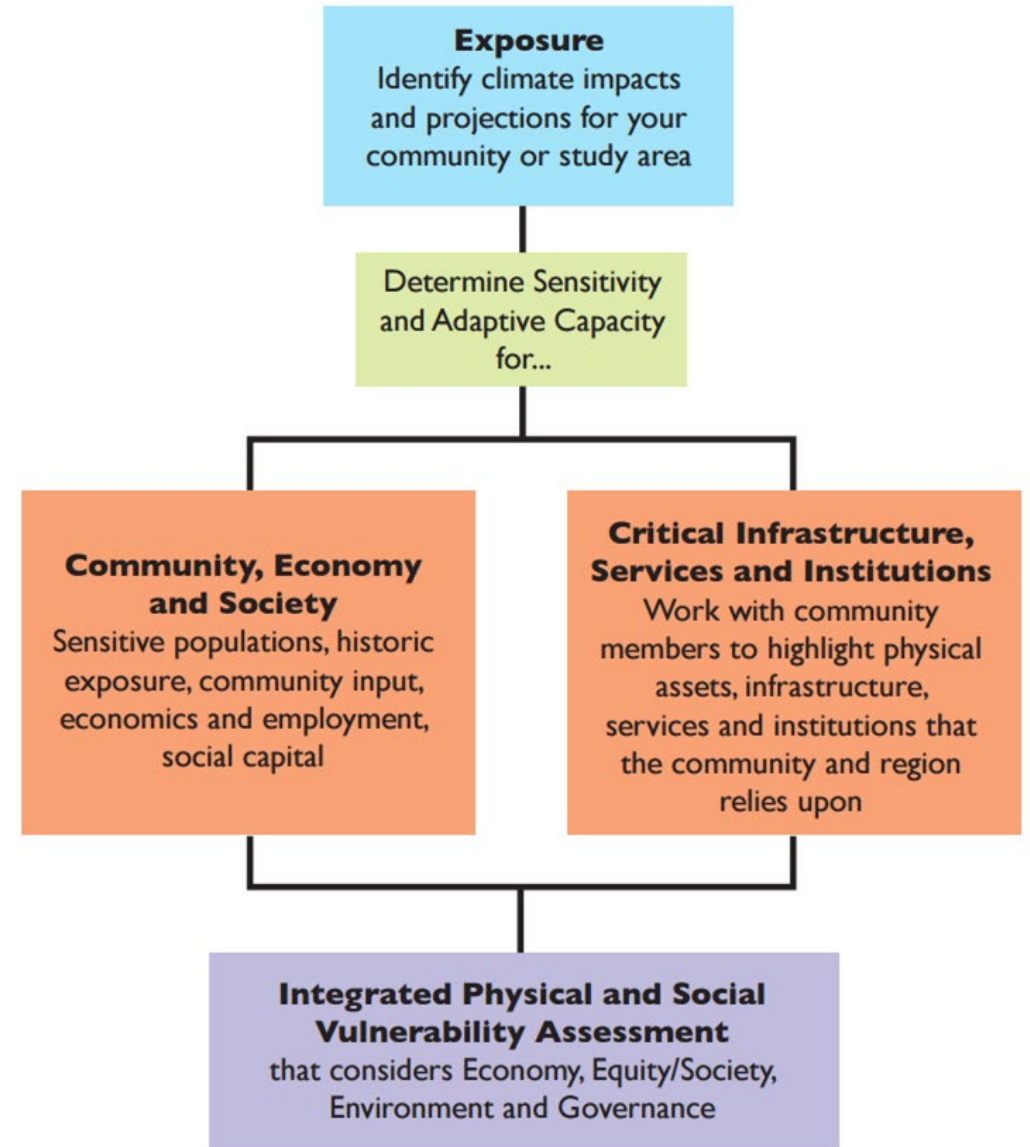
Additional Goals & Outcomes

JEDI and Climate Resilience Planning

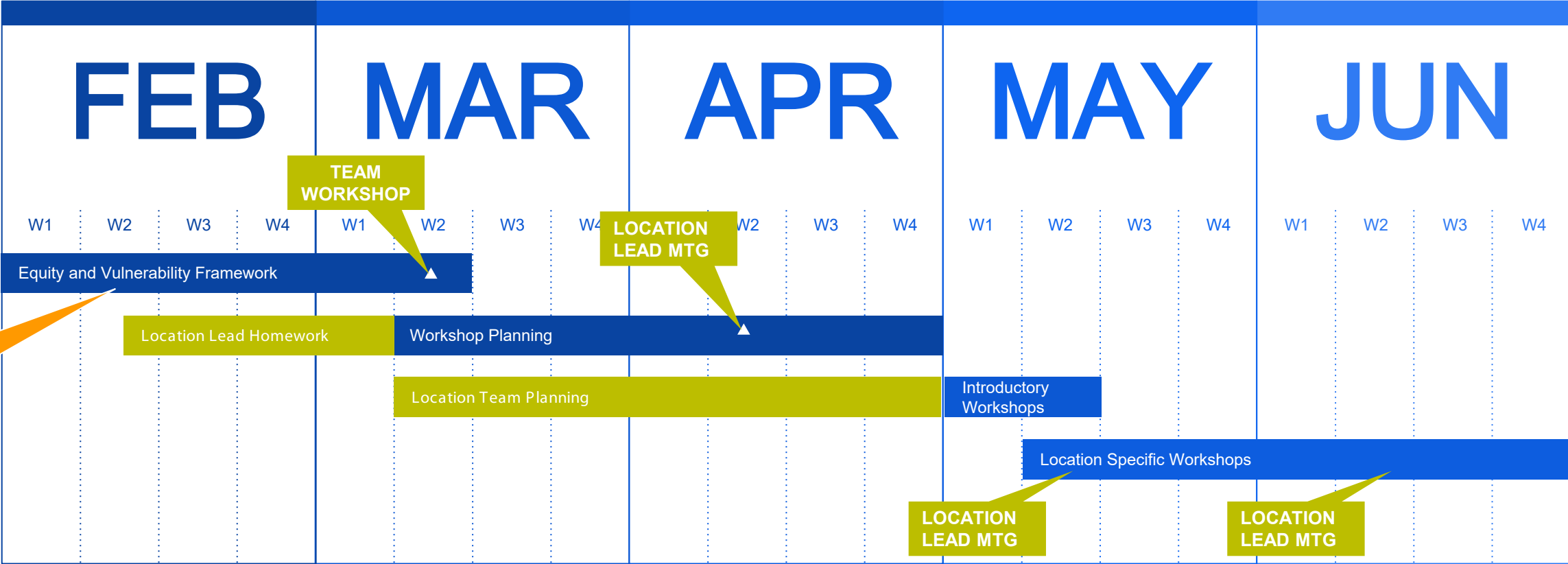
- Expanding out of campus-centered efforts
